APPLICATION INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS:

- 1) No person shall keep, hold, or possess in captivity for the purposes of rehabilitation any live wildlife, without first obtaining a Wildlife Rehabilitation Permit from the Director or his designee.
- 2) Applicant must be an Alabama resident age 19 or older, and a legal resident of the United States.
- 3) Applicant must submit documentation from a laboratory or physician of receipt of tetanus vaccination within the last 10 years.
- 4) Applicant must submit a nonrefundable \$75 administration fee with application payable to the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.
- 5) First-time applicant must score at least 80% on a written examination administered by the Division. Examination will be administered by appointment at any Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division office.
- 6) Applicant must submit a Letter of Support from a licensed veterinarian practicing in Alabama which indicates that they are willing to cooperate with the applicant as needed for medication distribution, medical procedures, and euthanasia.
- 7) Applicant must submit a letter from their corresponding County Commission or City Council confirming that containing wildlife is not prohibited on the Facility property by local laws or ordinances.
- 8) Applicant must possess suitable enclosures for designated species:
 - a) For mammals*, reptiles, and game birds: applicant must possess indoor enclosures for designated wildlife species which are housed in a detached structure separate from human and domestic pet habitation, with its own potable water and electrical power supply, and that are equal to or larger than those listed for "nursing/pre-weaned" in *Minimum Standards for Wildlife Rehabilitation (4rd Edition)* published by the National Wildlife Rehabilitator's Association (NRWA). First-time applicant must submit photos and dimensions of these indoor enclosures to the Division and submit to an on-site inspection of these enclosures by Division staff before permit will be issued. *Indoor enclosures are not required for deer.
 - b) For mammals, reptiles, and game birds: Applicant must possess outdoor enclosures for designated wildlife species that are equal to or larger than those dimensions listed for "juveniles outside" in: *Minimum Standards for Wildlife Rehabilitation (4rd Edition)* published by the National Wildlife Rehabilitator's Association (NRWA). First-time applicants must submit photos and dimensions of these outdoor enclosures to the Division and submit to an on-site inspection of these enclosures by Division staff before permit will be issued.
 - c) For migratory birds listed in 50 CFR 10.13: applicant must possess enclosures as required by the USFWS and supply the Division with a copy of a current Federal Migratory Bird Rehabilitation Permit issued by the USFWS before being considered for a permit to rehabilitate migratory birds in Alabama. In addition to federal requirements, permittee must comply with state requirements for migratory bird rehabilitation. Both federal and state rehabilitation permits are required to possess migratory birds for the purposes of rehabilitation. A federal bird rehabilitation permit holder may not possess migratory birds for the purposes of rehabilitation unless they are also granted an Alabama Wildlife Rehabilitation Permit.
- 9) A Wildlife Rehabilitation Permit is issued to an individual named permittee, and wildlife must be kept at the location(s) specified on the permit. Volunteers may assist the permittee at the permittee's authorized, inspected facility and may not care for animals away from the designated facility. A permittee using volunteers shall keep on file an updated list of volunteers and their contact information and provide this information to Division staff upon request.
- 10) Wildlife Rehabilitation Permits are not issued to individuals who are holding wildlife in captivity illegally or who have had prior incidents or complaints related to wildlife violations.
- 11) The Division may elect to deny a permit despite general requirements being met if there is no demonstrated need for rehabilitators in the permittee's area or for other reasons at the discretion of the Division.

DEFINITIONS:

"Division" – Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

"Director" - The Director of the Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Division of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

"Wildlife" – Wild animal species, to include all species designated as game animals in 220-2-.06, furbearers designated in 220-2-.30, those listed as protected nongame species in 220-2-.92, game birds designated in 220-2-.04, and all bird species protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act as listed in 50 CFR 10.13.

"Designated Species" – Those wildlife species which a rehabilitator is specifically permitted to possess for the purposes of rehabilitation.

"Animal" – any individual specimen being held under a Wildlife Rehabilitation Permit.

"Rehabilitation" – the action or process of restoring wildlife to a condition of health after illness or injury, or of maintaining health in young wildlife to an age of independence, with the goal of its release into the wild. Rehabilitation activities also include euthanasia.

"Wildlife Rehabilitator" – an individual person authorized by permit to conduct rehabilitation activities; permittee.

"Facility" – The authorized location(s) approved for Wildlife Rehabilitation Permit activities.

"USFWS" - The United States Fish & Wildlife Service

APPLICATION PROCEDURES:

- 1). Applicant must complete and submit the Wildlife Rehabilitation Permit Application and Release of Liability to the address indicated on the form along with nonrefundable \$75 administrative fee payable to the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources in addition to the following:
 - a) Copy of driver's license.
 - b) Documentation of tetanus vaccination.
 - c) Letter of Support from a licensed veterinarian practicing in Alabama.
 - d) Letter from County Commission or City Council.

All required documents must be submitted collectively via mail to:

- 2). Division will contact applicant via email to confirm receipt of application documents, provide information about and schedule written examination, and indicate designated species.
- 3.) After scoring at least 80% on written examination, applicant can begin construction of enclosures as indicated for designated species.
- 4). Applicant must submit photos and dimensions of all enclosures to: DCNR.wildliferehabilitation@dcnr.alabama.gov

- 5). Division will contact applicant via email to confirm receipt of enclosure information and schedule a Division inspection of completed enclosures.
- 6). Upon successful completion of the above, a Wildlife Rehabilitation Permit may be issued in the form of a letter which will include specific permit conditions and term of permit. Permit applications are reviewed on an annual basis and permit conditions are subject to change.
