

Point of Clarification: The Resident 64 All Game Hunting, Resident 64 Small Game Hunting, and the Resident 64 Freshwater Fishing all include the Wildlife Heritage License privileges.

Questions from October 21, 2009 email

Below are the answers to your questions:

1. What does Resident 64 and Non Resident 64 mean and to what license sub-categories do these licensees apply?

There are no Non Resident 64 licenses. The Resident 64 license is sold when a resident is 64 years old which is the last year they are required to purchase a license. For the purpose of this survey they are no different than the regular license sold for a license type for example Resident 64 All Game Hunting would be treated like Resident All Game Hunting.

I do not understand your question concerning sub-categories. If you mean which license types, they are all game hunting, small game hunting, wildlife heritage, freshwater fishing, and saltwater fishing. See license groups beginning with 700 in the table provided.

2. If license codes 100-1100, 100-1200 and 200-1000 contain Wildlife Heritage, what is their count for each category and does your electronic records provide a means to split out those records?

The Resident All Game Hunting, Resident Small Game Hunting and the Resident Freshwater Fishing all contain the Wildlife Heritage License. The Wildlife Heritage License grants the ability to hunt small game on Wildlife Management Areas, fish in State owned fishing lakes, and bank fish with hook and line in your county of residence. These are limited hunting and fishing privileges however they do count as having a hunting and fishing license. When determining the Resident Hunting %'s the survey will have to determine how many people that bought a Resident Freshwater Fishing license which included limited hunting privileges also bought other hunting licenses. We can only count the number of people that did not buy a duplicate hunting privilege. The electronic records show what license types a person bought.

3. What is the difference between licenses designed 300-1000 and 300-1010? Which apply to the Resident Saltwater Annual audit category?

The Resident Saltwater Fishing license had a price change during the year the two group codes were an internal way of tracking sales. Both of the group codes apply to the Resident Saltwater Category.

4. What determines Resident Wildlife Heritage from the other categories including Wildlife Heritage? What are the counts of the appropriate records and is there a code for breaking out these records?

The license type Resident Wildlife Heritage only includes the limited hunting and fishing privileges as described in #2. When a license has includes Wildlife Heritage that means it has the full privilege that is listed such as All Game Hunting but also includes the limited fishing privileges as listed in #2. The counts for the records (# licenses sold) are shown in the table. Each license type has a unique group code.

5. Does Resident Recreational Net (Code number 350-1000) applicable to hunting or fishing, or both?

Resident Recreational Net is applicable to fishing only .

6. What is the difference between Non Resident Saltwater Annual All Other States Codes 300-2000 and 300-2010 and does your electronic records provide a means to split out those records?

The Non Resident Saltwater Fishing license had a price change during the year the two group codes were an internal way of tracking sales. Both of the group codes apply to the Non Resident Saltwater Category. The electronic records show what license types a person bought.

7. What is the difference between Non Resident Saltwater Annual Florida Codes 300-3000 and 300-3010 and does your electronic records provide a means to split out those records?

8. What is the difference between Non Resident Saltwater & Freshwater Annual Louisiana Codes 300-4000 and 300-4010 and does your electronic records provide a means to split out those records?

9. What License Code Number applies to Non resident Freshwater Trip Florida?

The license group # is 200-3500.

Question from October 22, 2009 email

We need a more precise definition as to what the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources expects in a 100% count and what other type of information is to be gather, if any, from these licensees.

Answer

The licenses listed in the “Count at 100%” for each license category would not be surveyed at all for that license category. For example for Resident Hunting the two license types listed under “Count at 100%” would not be surveyed and the license types listed in “To Be Surveyed” would be surveyed. This will change depending on the license category.

The only information to be gathered from the licensees surveyed is the required information to determine what license types they purchased during the appropriate time period.
