

These marinas have installed pumpout stations that allow boaters to properly dispense of their sewage. Dumping sewage into our waters not only impacts the environment but also every living creature in it.

Although many marinas are free, sometimes there is a minimal cost involved in using a marina’s pumpout station. But it is nothing compared to the cost we will all pay if we don’t do anything. Plus, there are fines if you’re caught polluting the water. The easiest and most responsible thing to do is to comply.
