

- LOCATION:** Two miles west of Rogersville in northwest Alabama, off U.S. Highway 72. The Park is approximately 50 miles west of Huntsville and 27 miles east of Florence. Interstate 65 and Athens are 22 miles east of the park.



- HOURS OF OPERATION:** 7 a.m. - Until Sundown
- ADMISSION:** \$1 Adults and youth ages 12 and over, \$.50 seniors ages 62 and over and children ages 6-11, children under 6 admitted free.
- RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES:** hiking trails, mountain biking trail, golf, tennis courts, playground, swimming area and swimming pool.
- MARINA:** Boat rentals, 70 covered boat slips, 88 uncovered sailboat slips, 64 transient slips, store, and fuel.
- RESTAURANT:** Open 7 days a week serving breakfast, lunch and dinner. Friday and Saturday night buffets and Sunday brunch.
- MEETING FACILITIES:** Groups and meetings up to 400 people for business meetings, weddings, family reunions, fishing tournaments, etc. Catering is available.
- RESORT LODGE:** 75 lakeside rooms with private balconies, suites, lakeside pool.
- COTTAGES:** 10 new two- and three-bedroom lakeside cottages with fireplaces, satellite television and DVD player, fully stocked kitchens and beautiful furnishings.
- CABINS:** Brick and wood cabins that accommodate 2 to 15 guests.
- ELK RIVER GROUP LODGE:** 13 bedrooms, commercial kitchen and large dining area.
- CAMPING:** 116 campsites in the improved campground - 110 RV sites with water, electric, sewer (\$19.80 per night); and primitive sites (\$11 per night for two people).
- GROUP PICNIC PAVILIONS:** \$60 per day.

Joe Wheeler Resort State Park

Whether you arrive by land or water, there's no mistaking the beauty and serenity of this 2,550-acre resort park. On the shores of Wheeler Lake, the resort features

a stunning, waterfront lodge with restaurant and convention facilities, championship 18-hole golf course and clubhouse, full-service marina with permanent and overnight docking slips, modern and primitive camping, new lakeside cottages, cozy cabins, and a rustic group lodge.

The park is divided by the Tennessee River, which forms the 69,700-acre Wheeler Lake, an angler and boater's paradise. Bass, bream and catfish are plentiful in the sparkling waters where

sailboats and yachts cruise side by side. Each fall, Joe Wheeler Resort State Park hosts the Fall Rendezvous of boaters traveling the Great Loop – the continuous waterway that circumnavigates the eastern portion of North America, along the Atlantic Seaboard, across the Great Lakes, through inland rivers and around the Gulf of Mexico. As many as 250 vessels dock at Joe Wheeler's marina and attend the conference in the resort lodge, coordinated by the park's professional meeting planners.

Colorfully adorning the shoreline, are newly constructed lakeside cottages featuring back decks overlooking the water, satellite televisions and DVD players, fireplaces, fully equipped kitchens and beautiful furnishings.

Nearby attractions include the Pond Spring home of Confederate General and U.S. Congressman Joseph Wheeler located near Courtland, Alabama; The Alabama Renaissance Faire, Frontier Days Celebration, and Trail of Tears Celebration in nearby Florence; Helen Keller's home and the Alabama Music Hall of Fame in Tusculumbia; and the U.S. Space and Rocket Center in Huntsville.
