

## HUNT COMPARTMENTS


- ZONE 1**  
Mixed mature timber with ridges, hills, creek bottoms and wildlife openings.
- ZONE 2**  
Mixed mature timber with ridges, deep bottoms, abundant open ground and planted food plots.
- ZONE 3**  
Mixed mature timber with ridges, steep slopes and a large creek bottom.
- ZONE 4**  
Mixed timber with a planted food plot, creek bottom and steep slopes.
- ZONE 5**  
Mixed timber, large openings, some creek bottom & steep slopes.
- ZONE 6**  
Mixed timber, some openings, food plot, creek bottom, upland, some steep slopes.
- ZONE 7**  
A lot of creek bottom, some steep hills, large opening next to creek.
- ZONE 8**  
Some creek bottom, hills with mixed timber, some pine stands, one large opening.
- ZONE 9**  
Mostly pine timber, a food plot & opening, some hardwood in drains, some hills.
- ZONE 10**  
Some open clearcut areas & mixed timber, pine plantations, one large food plot, several openings, creek bottom.
- ZONE 11**  
Mostly open pine timber and thick plantations, some mixed hardwood timber in drains, a couple of openings.
- ZONE 12**  
Partially clearcut pine stand with some mixed hardwood timber in drains, some hills, mostly flat.
- ZONE 13**  
Mixed timber, some ridges, some steep slopes, a couple of food plots, creek bottom, river flood plain.
- ZONE 14**  
Mixed timber, some upland, ridges, creek bottom, river flood plain, large openings, food plots.
- ZONE 15**  
Mixed timber in upland, large food plots, some steep hills, creek bottom.




**Hunting Regulations - September 2016 - August 2017**

**PERMITS:** For the Youth Squirrel, Archery Deer and Youth Gun Deer Hunts, registration will be available on a first come - first served sign-up process on the [www.outdooralabama.com](http://www.outdooralabama.com) website **beginning on September 27<sup>th</sup>**. The actual physical hunting permits will be issued to those individuals successfully registered on the day of each hunt from the checking station located on the Fred T. Stimpson CHA beginning at 5:00a.m for the deer hunts and 6:00 a.m. for the squirrel hunts. The Youth Squirrel hunt permit holder and youth hunter are allowed to have up to 4 guests (which may consist of 3 youth hunters and an additional supervising adult, 21 years or older), the Archery Deer hunt permit holder must be properly licensed and is allowed to have one properly licensed hunting guest and the Youth Gun Deer hunt permit holder and youth hunter may have one youth hunting guest accompanied by a properly licensed supervising adult 21 years or older. For the youth squirrel and youth deer hunts, the permit holder must be 21 years or older or the parent. Each hunt will be limited to 15 permits and hunting participants are only allowed to hunt in their selected Zone. Scouting and portable stand placement is permissible the day prior to Youth Gun Deer hunts and Archery Deer hunts only in the hunter's assigned zone and preceding the hunter's assigned hunt date. Fred T. Stimpson Maps may be acquired from the Wildlife Office, 30571 Five Rivers Boulevard, Spanish Ft., AL., Mon.-Fri. from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., on the [www.outdooralabama.com](http://www.outdooralabama.com) website or by writing to Bruce Todd, 30571 Five Rivers Boulevard, Spanish Ft., AL 36527 (Phone [251] 626-5474). Include a large self-addressed, stamped envelope and your current license number. **All squirrel and deer harvested must be recorded at the checking station** located at 1415 Stimpson Sanctuary Road, Jackson, AL 36545.

**NOTE:**

- **A State Hunting License, Wildlife Management Area (WMA) License and a wildlife management area permit, are required by all archery deerhunt limited quota permit holders and guests and parents or supervisors assisting youth hunting deer and squirrel.**
- **Youth hunters on youth squirrel and youth deer hunts must be less than 16 years of age. Supervisors must be 21 years old or older, or a parent, and must be properly licensed. Youth must remain within 30 feet of supervisors at all times.**
- **Statewide antlered buck season bag limit applies to all WMAs.**
- **Administrators of the hunt shall have the right to distribute the hunters and to inspect all vehicles or other equipment while on the areas. The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and landowners, who are making the hunting possible, hereby put each hunter on notice that he hunts at his own risk and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and such landowners shall not be responsible for any accidents or injuries that may occur.**

**HUNTING DATES:**

**DEER:** (Archery)- Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice (except spotted fawns): **Oct. 29, Dec. 31, Feb. 4.** By limited quota permit only for the specified hunt. Two deer per day - One unantlered deer and one antlered buck. Limited quota permit holders must be properly licensed with a valid hunting license and wildlife management area license. The archery hunt permit holder may have one properly licensed hunting guest on that specified hunt date and in specified zone. **The archery hunt permit holder and guest are allowed to hunt.**

(Youth)--- Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice (except spotted fawns): **Nov. 12, Nov. 26 and Dec. 17.** By limited quota permit only for the specified hunt. Two deer per day - One unantlered deer and one antlered buck. Youth permit holder and youth hunter may have one youth guest hunter accompanied by a properly licensed supervising adult 21 years or older.. The permit holder must be 21 years or older or the parent of the youth. The youth and/or youth guest are to hunt under the guidance of the supervising adult on the specified hunt day and in specified zone. **Only the youth are allowed to hunt.**

**SQUIRREL:** (Youth)--- **Oct. 8 and Oct. 22.** By limited quota permit only for the specified hunt and zone. Youth permit holder and youth hunter may have up to 4 hunting guests which may consist of 3 youth hunters and an additional supervising adult, 21 years or older. Hunters are required to hunt together and remain in their assigned zone on their specified hunt date. **The squirrel hunt permit holder, youth hunter and guests are allowed to hunt.**

**BOBCAT, COYOTE, FERAL SWINE & FOX:---** Open during any other scheduled WMA hunting season using weapons and ammunition approved for those hunts. No Dogs allowed. Daylight hours only. One fox per day. Limited to quota permit holders for the specified permit days and in their specified zone.

**BAG LIMITS:**

*Deer:* Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns) - 2 a day - one unantlered deer and one antlered buck; Squirrel - 8 a day, Feral Swine & Coyote - no bag limit; Fox - 1 a day.

**PERMITTED FIREARMS, BOW AND ARROW, & FALCONRY:**

**Deer: Stalk Hunts:** For Youth gun deer hunts - As defined in Alabama Regulations legal arms and ammunition in 220-2-.02(2), (excluding buckshot). For Archery deer hunts - As defined for archery equipment in 220-2-.03.

**Squirrel:** As defined in Alabama Regulations legal arms and ammunition in 220-2-.02(7).

**IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL:**

1. To hunt, trap, use dogs, possess firearms, ammunition, traps, or bow and arrow without a valid permit. A permit is valid only during scheduled management and refuge area seasons during legal hunting hours and only with weapons and ammunition permitted for hunting the wildlife listed on permit.
2. To use dogs for stalk hunting of deer.
3. To use dogs for hunting, training, or any purpose from March 1 to the opening of the following fall gun season.
4. For any person under 16 years of age to hunt on the management area unless accompanied by a licensed hunter at all times.
5. For any person to hunt deer with gun or bow and arrow on scheduled gun deer hunts without first presenting his required hunting license at the checking station.
6. For any person to carry in or on a vehicle, any of the following: any firearms (including pistols) with ammunition in the magazine, breech or clip attached to firearms, or black powder weapons with primer, cap or flash powder in place, or cocked crossbows. See (21) for limited exception for certain lawfully licensed handguns possessed for personal protection.
7. To kill or willfully molest any species of wildlife except those designated for hunting. However, this regulation shall not apply to coyote and feral hogs which may be killed during all scheduled management area hunts, when possessing a valid permit and using weapons and ammunition that are legal for such designated hunts (DAYLIGHT HOURS ONLY) (NO DOGS ALLOWED). Additionally, bobcat and fox may be killed during all scheduled deer hunts, when possessing a valid permit and using weapons and ammunition that is legal for such designated hunts (DAYLIGHT HOURS ONLY) (NO DOGS ALLOWED). Only one fox may be harvested per day.
8. To discharge fireworks at any time.
9. To discharge firearms for target practice.
10. To hunt or discharge firearms within 150 yards of any camping area, dwelling, dam or timber operation, or 100 yards of any paved public road or highway; within a posted safety zone or on Sunday within one-half mile of any church or from within the right-of-way of any developed road open to vehicular traffic.
11. **To possess any open alcoholic beverages.**
12. To transport deer from the management area before being examined at the checking station or having recorded harvest data on the reporting form provided at the checking station.
13. For any person except authorized personnel to operate any motor driven vehicle behind, under, or around any locked gate, barricaded road, or sign which prohibits vehicular traffic.
14. For any unauthorized person at any time to operate a motor scooter, motorcycle, trail bike, or any motor driven vehicle on the management area except on regularly used roads open for public use by four-wheel vehicle traffic.
15. For any person to hunt deer on days of scheduled gun hunts without wearing an outer garment above the waist containing a minimum 144 square inches of hunter orange color or either a full size hunter orange hat or cap. The hunter orange must be of solid color, except for a small logo on the front of the cap, and visible from any angle.
16. For any person except authorized personnel to block or otherwise stop traffic on any road by parking a vehicle in such a way that passage around the vehicle is impossible.
17. To deposit, distribute, or scatter grain, salt, litter, or any other materials on management area prior to receiving approval from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.
18. For any person to damage or remove any trees, crops, or other plants, dirt, gravel, or sod from management area without legal authorization.
19. To erect or use a permanent tree stand or scaffold on management area without written permission from the landowners.
20. To hunt from an elevated stand or platform without attaching themselves to the tree or platform with a full body safety harness capable of supporting their weight.
21. Nothing in this regulation prohibits or requires a wildlife management area permit for the possession of handguns by lawfully licensed persons for the personal protection, provided the handguns are not used to hunt or take or attempt to take wildlife except as otherwise provided by this regulation.
