Hunting Regulations – September 2018 – August 2019

PERMITS: Gun deer permits will be issued daily from the check station on the Nov. 23-24 and Jan. 5th hunts only. This map will serve as a permit for all other deer hunting, small game hunting, and turkey hunting. Season small game, archery deer (other than days of gun deer hunts), youth deer, primitive weapons, special feral swine season, and all turkey permits are available at the checking station & kiośk; locally at St. Clair Grocery, County Road 29, St. Clair; U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Office, Hwy. 80, and Shopper Stop #145, Hwy. 80, Lowndesboro (open 7 days a week 24 hours a day); or via the internet at www.outdooralabama.com. Requests for small game, archery deer, youth deer, and all turkey permits by mail should be sent to the Area Biologist at 227 Ridgeland Farm Road, Lowndesboro, AL 36752 (office phone (205) 339-5716). All deer, wild pigs, and turkey harvested must to the Area Biologist at 227 Ridgeland Farm Road, Trapping permits must

be obtained from the Area Biologist. LOCATION OF CHECKING STATION: Approximately 3.8 miles north of White Hall, AL at 227 Ridgeland Farm Road, Lowndesboro, AL 36752. Checking station will open from 4:30 am-6:30 pm on Nov. 23-24 and Jan. 5th hunt only. All permits and deer killed on gun deer hunts must be checked in at the checking station on Nov. 23-24 and Jan. 5th deer hunts only. On all other Gun deer & Primitive Weapon gun hunts listed below, the checking station will be open from 10:00 am-2:00 pm to collect data on harvested deer and provide additional assistance to WMA users. All deer, turkey, or hogs harvested must be reported at the checking station, kiosk, or contacting the Area Biologist.

NOTE: • A State Hunting License, Wildlife Management Area (WMA) License and a wildlife management area permit are required when hunting deer, turkey, or waterfowl on a Wildlife management area. For residents, a State hunting license or Wildlife Heritage License (residents only) and WMA permit are required for hunting small game, except waterfowl on wildlife management areas. Nonresidents must possess a wildlife management area license in addition to a hunting license and WMA permit to hunt big game and small game.

• Youth hunters on youth deer and turkey hunts must be less than 16 years of age. Supervisors must be 21 years old or older, or a parent, and must be properly licensed. Youth must remain within 30 feet of supervisors at all times.

Statewide antlered buck season bag limit applies to all WMAs, excluding Bonus Buck.

• Administrators of the hunt shall have the right to distribute the hunters and to inspect all vehicles or other equipment while on the areas. The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and Army Corps of Engineers, who are making the hunting possible, hereby put each hunter on notice that he hunts at his own risk and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and such landowners shall not be responsible for any accidents or injuries that may occur.

HUNTING DATES FOR DUTCH BEND TRACT ONLY:

DEER: Stalk Hunting Antlered Bucks Only: Oct. 15-24. One antlered buck per day. *Antlered buck restrictions apply. (Archery)

Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Oct. 25 – Feb. 10. Two deer per day - one unantlered deer and one antlered buck per day. *Antlered buck restrictions apply. All successful hunters must record their harvest at the check station or kiosk.

*To be legal for harvest, antlered bucks must have at least four (4) antler points (1 inch or longer) on at least one main beam.

State Season (12:00 noon until sunset). Saturdays and Wednesdays only.

Sep. 15 - Mar. 3. Hunting allowed Wednesday, Thursday and Friday only. Fox squirrel season closed during February and March. RABBIT & SQUIRREL:

WATERFOWL: State seasons (½ hour before sunrise to 12:00 noon). Saturdays, Mondays, and Wednesdays only.

FERAL SWINE & COYOTE: Open during any other scheduled Hunting Season on the Dutch Bend Tract using weapons and ammunition approved for those hunts. No dogs allowed. Daylight hours only.

HUNTING DATES FOR REMAINDER OF LOWNDES WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA:

DEER: Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Nov. 10-11. Two deer per day - one unantlered deer and one antlered buck. All successful hunters must record their (Youth)

harvest at the check station or kiosk.

Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: **Nov. 23-24 Jan. 18-19**, **Feb. 2-3**. Two deer per day - one unantlered deer and one antlered buck. All hunters must obtain a permit from the check station prior to hunting. The check station will be open from 4:30 am to 6:30 pm All deer harvested must be brought to the Check (Gun)

Station for data collection. *Antlered buck restrictions apply.

Stalk Hunting Antlered Bucks Only: Nov. 30-Dec. 2, Dec. 14-16, Dec. 28-30, Jan. 4-5 (Jan. 5 Bonus Buck Day, must be validated by WFF personnel at the check station prior to leaving the Area) On Jan. 5th (bonus buck day) all hunters must obtain a permit from the check station prior to hunting. The check station will be open from 4:30 am to 6:30 pm. All deer harvested must be brought to the check station for data collection. One anthered buck per day. On all other gun deer hunts, the check station will be open from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm to collect data on harvested deer and provide additional assistance to WMA users. *Antlered buck restrictions apply.

(Primitive Weapons)

Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Nov. 14-16 and Dec. 3-8. Two deer per day - one unantlered deer and one antlered buck. *Antlered buck restrictions apply. All deer hunters must sign in each day of primitive weapons deer hunt at check station of kiosk prior to hunting. All successful hunters must record their harvest at the check station or kiosk. On all primitive weapons deer hunts, the check station will be open from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm to collect data on harvested deer and provide additional assistance to WMA users

Stalk Hunting Antlered Bucks Only Oct. 15-24. One antlered buck per day. *Antlered buck restrictions apply. (Archery)

Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Oct. 25 – Feb. 10. Two deer per day - one unantlered deer and one antlered buck per day. *Antlered buck restrictions apply. No hunting on days of youth gun deer hunt. All successful hunters must record their harvest at the check station or kiosk. Archery hunters must obtain deer permit on days of gun hunts and abide by all gun deer hunt regulations.

*To be legal for harvest, antlered bucks must have at least four (4) antler points (1 inch or longer) on at least one main beam.

TURKEY: Mar. 16 (daylight until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. Hunters must sign in each day at a kiosk orcheck station prior to hunting. All successful hunters (Youth) must record their harvest at the check station or kiosk.

Mar. 22 (daylight until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. Hunters must sign in at the kiosk or check station prior to hunting. All successful hunters must (Physically Disabled) record their harvest at the check station or kiosk.

Mar. 23 – Apr. 30 (daylight until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. All successful hunters must record their harvest at the check station or kiosk. (Regular)

RABBIT & SQUIRREL: Sep. 15 – Mar. 3. No hunting on days of scheduled youth, gun, and primitive weapons deer hunts. Fox squirrel season closed during February and March. QUAIL: Nov. 3 - Feb. 28. No hunting on days of scheduled youth, gun, and primitive weapons deer hunts.

SNIPE: Nov. 10 - Feb. 24. No hunting on days of primitive weapons and gun deer hunts.

WOODCOCK: **Dec. 14 – Jan. 27.** No hunting on days of gun deer hunts. CROW: **Sep.1 – Feb. 28.** No hunting on days of scheduled youth, gun, and primitive weapons deer hunts.

RACCOON & OPOSSUM: Sep. 1 - Mar. 3 (nighttime hours only). No hunting on nights preceding or nights of scheduled youth, gun, and primitive weapons deer hunts. Fox

hunting: dogs only - no weapons.

Open during any other scheduled WMA Hunting Season using weapons and ammunition approved for those hunts. No Dogs Allowed. Daylight Hours DOVE: State seasons (12:00 noon until sunset). Saturdays and Wednesdays only. No hunting on days of scheduled youth, primitive weapons and gun deer

hunts. WATERFOWL: State seasons (1/2 hour before sunrise to 12:00 noon). Saturdays and Wednesdays only. No hunting on days of scheduled youth, primitive weapon and gun

FERAL SWINE (Special Season): Sept. 1-10 and Feb. 28 - Mar. 3. Permitted firearms & archery equipment and hunter orange requirements same as for gun deer hunts on the WMA.

No buckshot. No dogs allowed. Daylight hours only. FURBEARER TRAPPING

(excluding feral swine): Nov. 3 - Feb. 28. Trapping permits must be obtained from Area Biologist. All trappers must wear hunter's orange while trapping on days of gun deer hunts.

BAG LIMITS: Deer (antlered bucks only hunts) - minimum of four (4) points, 1-inch or longer, on at least one antler - 1 a day; deer (hunter's choice hunts) - either-sex (except spotted fawns) - two deer per day-one unantlered deer

and one antiered buck (antier restrictions apply); turkey (gobblers only) – 1 a day (5 per season); squirrel – 8 a day; rabbit – 8 a day; raccoon & opossum – no limit; mourning dove – 15 a day; crow – no limit; feral swine – no limit; coyote – no limit; bobcat – no limit; fox – 1 a day; waterfowl – State and Federal regulations apply.

PERMITTED FIREARMS, BOW AND ARROW, & FALCONRY:

As defined in Alabama Regulations legal arms and ammunition in 220-2-.02(2), (excluding buckshot) and archery equipment in 220-2-.03.
Using only muzzle loading rifles (.40 caliber or larger), muzzle loading shotguns, air-powered guns (.30 caliber or larger) or archery equipment as defined in Deer: Stalk Hunts: Primitive Weapons:

220-2-.03. As defined in 220-2-.02(3), except no center-fire pistols.

Special Feral Swine Hunts: Remainder of Seasons: Same as Stalk Deer Hunts (**Hunter Orange Requirements Apply**). Legal arms and ammunition as defined in 220-2-.02 and archery equipment in 220-2-.03.

Falconry will be legal on all AREA scheduled hunts for legally permitted falconers; following the dates those seasons are open on each AREA.

BOBCAT, COYOTE, FERAL SWINE

& FOX:

- To hunt, trap, use dogs, possess firearms, traps, or bow and arrow without a valid permit.
- To use dogs for stalk hunting of deer or for turkey hunting. To conduct organized man drives during stalk hunts outside the hours of 10:00 AM- 2:00 PM.
- For any person under 16 years of age to hunt on any WMA unless accompanied by a licensed hunter, at least 21 years of age, at all times.

 For any person to carry in or on a vehicle, any of the following: any firearms [including pistols/handguns, except as described in (23)] with ammunition in the magazine, breech or clip attached to firearms, or black powder
- weapons with primer, cap or flash powder in place, or cocked crossbows. See (23) for limited exception for certain lawfully licensed handguns possessed for personal protection.
- To camp on any WMA except in designated sites. Individuals or groups may camp on WMAs for a period not to exceed nine (9) days in any thirty (30) day period. Campfires must be extinguished before departing. To kill or willfully molest any species of wildlife except those designated for hunting. However, this regulation shall not apply to coyote or feral swine, which may be killed during all scheduled WMA hunts, when possessing a valid
- permit and using weapons and ammunition that are legal for such designated hunts during daylight hours only.
- 8. To discharge fireworks at any time.
- To discharge firearms for target practice.
- To hunt or discharge firearms within 150 yards of any camping area, dwelling, dam or timber operation, 100 yards of any paved public road or highway; within a posted safety zone or on Sunday within one/half mile of any church or from within the right-of-way of any developed road which is open to vehicular traffic. To possess open alcoholic beverages outside designated camping areas.
- For any person to possess any firearm while hunting with bow and arrow or crossbow, except on days of either-sex gun deer hunts.
- To transport deer killed during the gun hunts from the WMA before being checked at the designated checking station, or kiosk otherwise for scientific data. For any person except authorized personnel to operate any motor driven vehicle behind, under or around any locked gate, barricaded road or sign which prohibits vehicular traffic.
- For any unauthorized person to possess and/or operate ANY UNLICENSED MOTOR DRIVEN VEHICLE (2, 3, 4, or 6 wheel) on Lowndes WMA.
- For any unauthorized person to ride or possess horses except on roads and trails open to four-wheel motorized vehicles or on roads and trails or in areas designated as open to horses, (except for raccoon hunters during the legal nighttime raccoon season where authorized). A valid WMA license and a valid WMA permit are required to ride and/or possess horses on Lowndes WMA.
- For any person to hunt deer or feral swine on days of scheduled youth or gun deer, or special feral swine hunts without wearing an outer garment above the waist containing a minimum of 144 square inches of hunter orange color or either a full-size hunter orange hat or cap. Hunters are not required to wear hunter orange when hunting from a stand elevated twelve (12) feet or more above the ground. The hunter orange must be of solid color, except for a small logo and/or printing on the front of the cap, and visible from any angle.
- For any person except authorized personnel to park in front of a closed gate, block or otherwise stop traffic on any road in such a way that passage around the vehicle is impossible.
- For any person to deposit, distribute or scatter grain, salt, litter, or any other materials on any WMA. To damage or remove any artifacts, trees, crops, or other plants, dirt, gravel or sod without legal authorization.
- To hunt from an elevated stand or platform without attaching themselves to the tree or platform with a full body safety harness capable of supporting their weight. To violate any posted restrictions on entry, hunting, fishing, or other conduct.

 Nothing in this regulation prohibits or requires a wildlife management area permit for the possession of handguns by lawfully licensed persons for personal protection, provided the handguns are not used to hunt or take or to
- attempt to take wildlife except as otherwise provided by this regulation.
