Hunting Regulations – September 2019 – August 2020

PERMITS: This map shall serve as your Season Hunting Permit for all game in accordance with season, species, bag limit, firearms and rules applicable to the WMA. Maps permits are available on the WMA at the checking station, or kiosk; locally at Wal-Mart, Skyland Blvd., Tuscaloosa; Woods and Waters, Skyland Blvd., Tuscaloosa; and Pleasant Valley Store, Hwy. 25 S., Hale County; and Academy Sports and Outdoors, Skyland Blvd., Tuscaloosa; or via the internet at www.outdooralabama.com. Requests for small game, archery deer, youth deer, primitive weapons deer, and all turkey permits by mail should be sent to Area Biologist Drew Tincher, 10949 County Road 50, Moundville, AL 35474 (office phone (205) 371-6375 or cell phone (334)430-6301). Include a large, self-addressed stamped envelope and current hunting license number. All deer , turkeys and feral swine harvested <u>must</u> be reported by completing the self-service form at the checking station, kiosk, or contacting the Area Biologist. <u>Trapping</u> permits must be obtained from the Area Biologist.

LOCATION OF CHECKING STATION: 11 miles east of Moundville on Hale County Road 50, adjacent to the Elliott Creek Work Center. The checking station will only be open from 7:30 am to 6:30 pm on every Saturday during a scheduled gun deer hunt to collect harvest data and assist WMA users.

- NOTE: A State Hunting License, Wildlife Management Area (WMA) License and a wildlife management area permit are required when hunting deer, turkey, or waterfowl on a wildlife management area. For residents, a State hunting license or Wildlife Heritage License (residents only) and WMA permit are required for hunting small game, except waterfowl on wildlife management areas. Nonresidents must possess a wildlife management area license in addition to a hunting license and WMA permit to hunt big game and small game.
 - Youth hunters on youth deer and turkey hunts must be less than 16 years of age. Supervisors must be 21 years old or older, or a parent, and must be properly licensed. Youth must remain within 30 feet of supervisors at all times.
 - Individuals ages 16 through 64 that utilize the shooting range on Oakmulgee WMA are required to possess a valid Wildlife Heritage License, State hunting license, WMA license, or resident annual freshwater fishing license, or pay the USFS fee of \$3.00 per vehicle.
 - Antlered buck restrictions apply Minimum of three (3) points (1 inch or more) on at least one main beam. Statewide antlered buck season bag limit applies to all WMAs.
 - Administrators of the hunt shall have the right to distribute the hunters and to inspect all vehicles or other equipment while on the areas. The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and landowners, who are making the hunting possible, hereby put each hunter on notice that he hunts at his own risk and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and such landowners shall not be responsible for any accidents or injuries that may

HUNTING DATES:

DEER: (Youth) Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Nov. 16-17. One deer per day, one unantlered deer or one antlered buck. Successful hunters must record harvest at check station or kiosk.

> (Gun) Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Nov. 23-24, and Dec. 27-29. One deer per day, one unantlered deer or one antlered buck. The check

station will be open from 7:30 am to 6:30 pm on every Saturday during a gun deer hunt to collect harvest data and assist WMA users. All deer harvested must be recorded at the check station, kiosk, or contact area biologist. *Antlered buck restrictions apply.

Stalk Hunting Antlered Bucks Only: Nov. 30-Dec. 1, Dec. 18-22, and Jan. 10-12. The check station will be open from 7:30 am to 6:30 pm on every Saturday during a gun deer hunt to collect harvest data and assist WMA users. All deer harvested must be recorded at the check station, kiosk, or contact area biologist. One antlered buck per day. *Antlered buck restrictions apply.

Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Nov. 18-21 and Dec. 10-15. Two deer per day, one unantlered deer and one antlered buck. The check (Primitive Weapons)

station will be open from 7:30 am to 6:30 pm on every Saturday during a gun deer hunt to collect harvest data and assist WMA users. All deer harvested must be recorded at the check station, kiosk, or contact area biologist. *Antlered buck restrictions apply.

Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Oct. 15 – Feb. 10. Two deer per day, one unantlered deer and one antlered buck. (Archery) Archery hunters must abide by all gun deer hunt regulations when hunting on days of gun deer hunts. All successful hunters must record

their harvest at the check station, kiosk, or contact area biologist.*Antlered buck restrictions apply.

*To be legal for harvest, antlered bucks must have at least three (3) antler points (1 inch or longer) on at least one main beam.

TURKEY: Mar. 21 (Daylight until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. Hunters must record harvest at Check Station, kiosk, or contact area biologist.

(Physically Disabled) Mar. 27 (Daylight until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. Hunters must record harvest at Check Station, or kiosk, or contact area biologist. Mar. 28 - May 3 (Daylight until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. Hunters must record harvest at Check Station, kiosk, or contact area biologist. (Regular)

RABBIT & SQUIRREL: Sep. 14 - Mar. 8. No hunting on days of gun deer hunts. Fox Squirrel season closed during February and March.

QUAIL: Nov. 2 – Feb. 29. No hunting on days of gun deer hunts. SNIPE: State Season. No hunting on days of gun deer hunts. WOODCOCK: State Season. No hunting on days of gun deer hunts. RACCOON & OPOSSUM: Sep. 1 – Feb. 29 (Nighttime Hours Only).

State season (12:00 noon until sunset). No hunting on days of gun deer hunts. DOVE:

BOBCAT, COYOTE, FERAL SWINE

Open during any other scheduled WMA Hunting Season using weapons and ammunition approved for those hunts. No Dogs Allowed. & FOX: Daylight Hours Only. One fox per day.

Sep. 1 – Feb. 29 No hunting on days of gun deer hunts.

WATERFOWL: State season. No hunting on days of gun deer hunts. FERAL SWINE (Special Hunt): Sep. 1-10. Permitted firearms & bow and arrow and hunter orange requirements same as for gun deer hunts on the WMA. No Dogs

Allowed. Daylight Hours Only. Successful hunters must record harvest at Check Station, kiosk or contact area biologist. FURBEARER TRAPPING

(excluding feral swine): Nov. 2 - Feb. 29. Trapping permits must be obtained from Area Biologist. All trappers must wear hunter's orange while trapping on days of gun deer hunts.

BAG LIMITS: Deer (antlered bucks only hunts) - Antlered bucks must have a minimum of three (3) points (1 inch or longer) on at least one main beam - 1 a day (statewide antlered buck season bag limit applies), - 1 a day (statewide antlered buck season bag limit applies; deer (archery, primitive weapons, hunter's choice gun hunts) - either-sex (except spotted fawns) – two deer per day-one unantlered deer and one antlered buck (statewide antlered buck season bag limit applies); squirrel – 8 a day; rabbit – 8 a day; quail – 8 a

day; woodcock-3 a day; snipe-8 a day; raccoon-5 a day; opossum-no limit; fox-1 a day; bobcat-no limit; mourning dove-15 a day; crow-no limit; waterfowl-State and day; bobcat-no limit; mourning dove-15 a day; crow-no limit; waterfowl-State and day; bobcat-no limit; mourning dove-15 a day; crow-no limit; waterfowl-State and day; bobcat-no limit; mourning dove-15 a day; crow-no limit; waterfowl-State and day; bobcat-no limit; mourning dove-15 a day; crow-no limit; waterfowl-State and day; bobcat-no limit; mourning dove-15 a day; crow-no limit; waterfowl-State and day; bobcat-no limit; mourning dove-15 a day; crow-no limit; waterfowl-State and day; bobcat-no limit; wFederal regulations apply; *turkey* (*gobblers only*) – 1 a day (5 per season); *feral swine* – no limit; *coyote* – no limit.

PERMITTED FIREARMS, BOW AND ARROW, & FALCONRY:

As defined in Alabama Regulations legal arms and ammunition in 220-2-.02(2), (excluding buckshot) and archery equipment in 220-2-.03. Deer:

Primitive Weapons: Using only muzzle loading rifles (.40 caliber or larger), muzzle loading shotguns, air-powered guns (.30 caliber or larger) or archery equipment as defined in 220-2-.03. As defined in 220-2-.02(3), except no center-fire pistols or crossbows allowed.

Special Feral Swine Hunts: Same as Stalk Deer Hunts (Hunter Orange Requirements Apply).

Remainder of Seasons: Legal arms and ammunition as defined in 220-2-.02 and archery equipment in 220-2-.03.

As Defined in 220-2-.30(2), except no .22 magnums are allowed. Trapping:

Falconry will be legal on all AREA scheduled hunts for legally permitted falconers; following the dates those seasons are open on each AREA.

IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL:

CROW:

- 1. To hunt, trap, use dogs, possess firearms, traps, or bow and arrow, except on open designated target ranges, without a valid permit. A permit is valid only during scheduled WMA seasons during legal hunting hours and only with the required hunting license(s) and stamps and only with weapons and ammunition permitted for hunting the wildlife listed on permit. See (26) for limited exception for certain lawfully licensed handguns possessed for personal protection.
- To use dogs for hunting of deer, turkey, or feral swine.
- To use dogs for hunting, training or any purpose from the end of small game season until August 31. For any person under 16 years of age to hunt on any WMA unless accompanied by a licensed hunter, at least 21 years of age, at all times.
- To have in possession any fully automatic rifle.
- For any person to carry in or on a vehicle, any of the following: any firearms [including pistols/handguns, except as described in (26)] with ammunition in the magazine, breech or clip attached to firearms, or black powder weapons with primer, cap or flash powder in place, or cocked crossbows. See (26) for limited exception for certain lawfully licensed handguns possessed for personal protection.
- To cast a light of any kind either handheld, affixed to vehicle, or otherwise between the hours of sunset and sunrise. This does not apply to headlights of traveling vehicles in a normal manner on open
- established roads. To conduct organized man drives during stalk deer hunts outside the hours of 10:00AM - 2:00PM. 8.
- To camp on any WMA except in designated sites. On Wildlife Management Areas located on National Forest lands hunters must camp in designated camping areas, not to exceed nine (9) days in any thirty (30) day period, unless excepted by U.S. Forest Service rules specific to a unit—see local Forest Service rules. Campfires must be extinguished before departing. No warming fires shall be permitted away
- To kill or willfully molest any species of wildlife except those designated for hunting. To discharge fireworks at any time.
- To discharge firearms for target practice, except on the designated shooting range. To hunt or discharge firearms within 150 yards of any camping area, dwelling, dam or timber operation, 100 yards of any paved public road or highway, or from within the right-of-way of any developed U.S.
- Forest Service road (paved or unpaved) which is open for vehicular traffic; within a posted safety zone or on Sunday within one/half mile of any church.
- For any person to possess any firearm while hunting with bow and arrow or crossbow, except on days of either-sex gun deer hunts (See 26 for limited exception). To transport deer killed during gun hunts from the WMA before being checked at the designated checking station during the mandatory checking station operation dates above, or kiosk otherwise for
- scientific data.
- For any person except authorized personnel to operate any motor driven vehicle behind, under or around any locked gate, barricaded road or sign which prohibits vehicular traffic. 16. For any unauthorized person at any time to operate any unlicensed motor scooter, motorcycle, trail bike, ATV, UTV, or other motor driven vehicle on the WMA. Utility right-of-ways are not open to vehicular 17.
- For any unauthorized person to ride or possess horses except on roads and trails open to four-wheel motorized vehicles.
- For any person except authorized personnel to park in front of a closed gate, block or otherwise stop traffic on any road or park a vehicle in such a way that passage around the vehicle is impossible. For any person to possess, deposit, distribute or scatter grain/corn, salt, litter, or any other materials on any WMA.
- To damage or remove any artifacts, trees, crops, or other plants, dirt, gravel or sod without legal authorization. For any person to hunt any wildlife species (except turkey, migratory birds and while hunting legally designated species during nighttime hours) without wearing the minimum requirement of hunter orange as described in regulation 220-2-.85
- To violate any posted restrictions on entry, hunting, fishing, or other conduct.
- To hunt from an elevated stand or platform without attaching themselves to the tree or platform with a full body safety harness capable of supporting their weight. 25. Nothing in this regulation prohibits or requires a wildlife management area permit for the possession of handguns by lawfully licensed persons for personal protection.

- For any person to field-dress or move any harvested antlered buck or turkey without first properly recording it on the hunter's Antlered Deer Harvest Record or Turkey Harvest Record form.
- To use the target ranges on Oakmulgee WMA without a valid State hunting license, WMA license, Wildlife Heritage license, or freshwater fishing license, or paying the USFS fee of \$3.00 per vehicle.
- Users should refer to WMA Regulation 220-2-.55 for the complete list of WMA specific regulations.
