Hunting Regulations - September 2020 - August 2021

PERMITS: This map or using the WMA App shall serve as your Season Hunting Permit for all game in accordance with season, species, bag limit, firearms and rules applicable to the WMA. All harvests of small game, deer and turkey should be recorded by WMA App or Daily Permit. Daily permit obtained from the Self-Service Check Station located on Boone Valley Road above the boat landing. Map/Regulations may be obtained in person between the hours of 8:00AM and 5:00PM, Monday through Friday or by mail from Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries office, 4101 AL Hwy. 21 N, Jacksonville, AL 36265. Send your request with a stamped self-addressed envelope; by phoning 256-435-5422; or by printing from the internet at www.outdooralabama.com (both pages of the internet map/permit must be together to be valid). Trapping permits are available from the District II office.

- NOTE: As per 220-2-.55 (10) A Wildlife Management Area (WMA) License (required for deer, turkey and waterfowl), PLUS the applicable Resident or Non-Resident Hunting License [for Alabama residents 16 through 64 years of age and for nonresidents 16 years of age and older], PLUS a WMA Permit [free of charge], are required for hunting on WMA; provided however, that properly licensed persons under the "Wildlife Heritage License" may hunt legal small game except waterfowl on WMA without the other licenses described herein. PLUS, in order to hunt waterfowl on WMA, all persons must have in addition to the otherwise required licenses and permit, a HIP and valid State (ages 16 through 64) and a valid Federal (ages 16 and over) Waterfowl Stamp.
 - Statewide antlered buck season bag limit applies to all WMAs.
 - Administrators of the hunt shall have the right to distribute the hunters and to inspect all vehicles or other equipment while on the WMA. The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and landowners, who are making the hunting possible, hereby put each hunter on notice that he hunts at his own risk and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and such landowners shall not be responsible for any accidents or injuries that may occur.

In addition to appropriate licenses, WMA Map Permit and Daily Permit are required in App or paper form on this WMA for all hunters 16 years of age and over. Hunters who fully complete the WMA Check-In/Check Out on the Outdoor Alabama App are not required to be in possession of paper copies of the WMA Map Permit or Daily Permit. Check-in and check-out must be completed upon arrival and departure of the WMA. If not using this feature of the app, hunters must have a signed paper copy of the Map Permit in their possession and complete a paper copy of the Daily Permit.

HUNTING DATES:

DEER: (Archery) Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice: Oct. 15 – Feb. 10.

One deer a day, either one unantlered deer or one antlered buck.

RABBIT & SOUIRREL: Sept. 12 – Mar. 7. Fox squirrel season closed during February and March.

Mar. 27 (daylight hours until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. (Youth) TURKEY:

Apr. 3 – May 2 (daylight hours until 1:00 p.m.). Gobblers only. (Regular)

QUAIL: Nov. 7 - Feb. 28 WOODCOCK: State Season

CROW: Sept. 5 - Mar.7

Open during any other scheduled WMA hunting season using weapons and ammunition approved for those hunts. FERAL SWINE & COYOTE:

No Dogs Allowed.

WATERFOWL: State Season.

BAG LIMITS: Deer - Hunter's Choice - One deer per day - one unantlered deer or one antlered buck; Turkey - (Gobblers only) - 1 a day (5 per season); Squirrel - 8 a day; Rabbit – 8 a day; Quail - 8 a day; Woodcock - 3 a day; Crow – no limit; Feral Swine and Coyote – No Limit; Waterfowl – State Season limits.

PERMITTED FIREARMS, BOW AND ARROW, & FALCONRY:

IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL:

- To hunt, trap, use dogs, possess firearms, ammunition, traps, or bow and arrow, without a valid permit. A permit is valid only during scheduled WMA seasons during legal hunting hours and only with weapons and ammunition permitted for hunting the wildlife listed on permit.
- To use dogs for deer or turkey hunting. (Leashed dogs may be used for the expressed purpose of retrieving wounded deer, limited to two dogs per tracking 2.
- To use dogs for hunting, training, or any purpose from the end of conventional small game season through August 31. 3.
- For any person under 16 years of age to hunt on the WMA unless accompanied by an adult who is 21 years or older or the parent and who possesses all license to hunt on WMA.
- For any person to carry in or on a vehicle, any of the following: any firearms (including pistols) with ammunition in the magazine breech or clip attached to firearms, or cocked crossbows. (See (19) for limited exception)
- To camp in the WMA. No warming fires shall be permitted on WMA.
- To kill or willfully molest any species of wildlife except those designated for hunting.
- To discharge fireworks at any time.
- To discharge firearms for target practice.
- To hunt or discharge firearms within 150 yards of any camping area, dwelling, dam or timber operation, or within 100 yards of any paved public road or highway, or within a posted safety zone or on Sunday within one-half mile of any church or from within the right-of-way of any developed road (paved or unpaved) which is open for vehicular traffic.
- For any unauthorized person to operate or possess ANY UNLICENSED MOTOR DRIVEN VEHICLE on the WMA or to operate a LICENSED motor scooter, motorcycle, trail bike, or any LICENSED motor driven vehicle on the WMA or power line right-of-way.
- For any person to hunt any wildlife species (except turkey, migratory birds and while hunting legally designated species during legal nighttime hours) 12. without wearing the minimum requirement of hunter orange as described in 220-2-.85.
- To deposit, distribute, or scatter grain, salt, litter, or any other materials on WMA. 13.
- For any person to damage or remove any artifacts, trees, crops, plants, dirt, gravel, or sod from WMA. 14.
- To hunt from an elevated stand or platform without attaching themselves to the tree or platform with a full body safety harness capable of supporting their 15. weight.
- To cast a light of any kind, either hand-held, affixed to a vehicle, or otherwise, between the hours of sunset and sunrise except in areas where the state law is 16. more restrictive. This paragraph does not apply to the headlights of vehicles traveling in a normal manner on an open established road.
- For any person, except authorized personnel, to operate any motor driven vehicle behind, under, or around any locked gate, barricaded road, or walk in 17. only sign.
- For any person, except authorized personnel, to park in front of a closed gate, block or otherwise stop traffic on any road by parking a vehicle in such a way 18. inhibits traffic.
- Nothing in this regulation prohibits or requires a WMA permit for the possession of handguns by lawfully licensed persons for the personal protection, 19. provided the handguns are not used to hunt or take or attempt to take wildlife except as otherwise provided by this regulation.
- Users should refer to WMA Regulation 220-2-.55 for the complete list of WMA specific regulations.
