

## Bass Anglers Information Team 1990 Annual Report

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## **INTRODUCTION**

In 1990 the B.A.I.T. program completed five years of bass tournament summarization. The objective of the program has always been to gather information on bass populations by combining the efforts of bass club members and state fisheries biologists. Reservoir creel surveys are expensive to conduct and cannot be undertaken on a statewide basis. The B.A.I.T. program summarizes catch data already being collected by participating clubs on reservoir bass populations.

Through 1989, 1,215 tournament reports were summarized. More than 120 clubs participated through the first four years of the program. All major reservoirs were fished by 30,882 participating fishermen, who spent 301,067 hours collecting data for this program. They caught 74,801 bass that weighed 119,180 pounds.

## **METHODS**

Every year an effort has been made to maintain the support of the previous years' clubs and to enlist the support of new clubs through newsreleases and letters. Participating club officers or tournament directors are sent the previous year's annual report, with tournament report postcards to be completed following each tournament. Clubs are assigned individual numbers to insure confidentiality. As tournament cards are received, they are checked for accuracy and entered into a computer database. Club officers are contacted when data are suspected to be erroneous.

Compilation and analysis of the data are performed following receipt of December tournament data. Statewide information is sorted by reservoir, and by participating club. To rank

reservoirs, five "fishing quality" indicators were used: percent of successful fishermen (percent of fishermen with one or more bass at weigh-in), bass average weight, number of bass per fisherman-day, pounds of bass per fisherman-day, and hours required to catch a bass five pounds or larger. Since the length of a fishing day varies between tournaments, a fisherman-day is defined as 10 hours of fishing effort. A minimum of five tournaments for an individual reservoir is considered necessary for minimum confidence in each reservoir dataset. Reservoirs with five or more tournament reports are ranked for each of the quality indicators. Values are assigned to each rank and an overall rank is determined for each reservoir by summing the values of the five quality indicators. This ranking system is intended to be a quick reference for club tournament site selection. It is not a "best and worst" list and should not be interpreted that way.

#### RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Bass clubs submitted 373 tournament reports during 1990 bringing the total to 1,588 for the five years of this program. The club representatives did an excellent job filling out the cards and few reports were rejected due to incomplete or erroneous information. One-hundred-and-thirteen more reports were received in 1990 than in 1989. Fifty-four clubs provided data in 1990, three more than in 1989. Seventy-one reports were received from Dr. Carl Quertermus of West Georgia College, who summarizes tournament data from the Georgia B.A.S.S. Federation. Without the assistance of Dr. Quertermus and the Georgia Federation, the B.A.I.T. data for 1990 would have included only

302 tournaments. Once again we must stress that reports from more locations increase the capability of the summaries to reflect actual conditions and not just a good or poor day's fishing by one or two clubs.

In 1990, tournament reports were received for 33 bodies of water that were fished 110,487 hours by 11,502 fishermen. B.A.I.T. anglers caught 27,729 bass (12 inches and larger) that weighed 45,874 pounds (Table 1). A total of 588 bass five pounds and larger were reported. One bass larger than 10 pounds was caught in Eufaula Reservoir (Table 5). Fewer fish over eight pounds were reported in 1990 compared to 1989 (14 vs 19). The influence of Florida bass is obvious in Table 5. Eufaula and West Point contain a naturally high incidence of Florida bass and Gainesville and Aliceville were stocked with Florida bass when these reservoirs were impounded in 1978 and 1980.

Bass Angler Sportsman Society (B.A.S.S.) tournaments were held on Gunterville and Martin during 1990. Two B.A.S.S. tournaments, a May Invitational and the November Megabucks, were held on Gunterville. The Pro-Am was held on Martin in November. B.A.I.T. fishermen on Martin compared favorably with the professionals regarding the average weight of bass caught. However, the catch rates (number and pounds of fish per hour) were considerably lower for B.A.I.T. fishermen than for the pros during all three tournaments (Figures 2 and 3).

Bass fishing showed steady improvement statewide each of the first four years of the B.A.I.T. program. In 1990 average weight of fish remained the same as in 1989, but number and pounds of fish caught per man-day declined (Figure 1). These declines were

not unexpected in light of the fact that these values rose each of the previous three years. Concern for this situation was expressed in last year's report. We proposed several factors, including recent mild winters and increasing fertility as possible explanations. Natural fluctuations in bass abundance and size structure are the norm, since environmental conditions vary from year to year. The declines observed in 1990 were moderate and the catch rates still exceeded those observed in 1986 and 1987.

Twenty-six clubs (including the Georgia Federation) submitted five or more tournament reports (47% of the clubs provided 61% of the data). Sixteen clubs submitted 10 or more reports, an increase of nine clubs from 1989 (Table 3). The West Alabama Bass Fishermans Association, Bluff City Bassmasters, Kowaliga Bassmasters, Alabama Bass Association, Uniroyal-Goodrich, Country Boy Trails, Bama Bassers, and Boeing Bass provided data on twelve or more tournaments. Every year, lack of full reporting by participating clubs remains a limiting factor in this program. Twenty-nine clubs submitted less than five reports each. All clubs should understand that every tournament report is important if this program is going to be successful. A list of B.A.I.T. clubs contributing tournament results in 1990 is presented in Table 4.

Overall, clubs were more conservative in their tournament rules than the limits allowed by Game and Fish Division regulations. Several clubs are committed to daily creel limits of five fish or less and size limits greater than 12 inches. These clubs are to be commended for their efforts to conserve

bass resources in Alabama. We noticed that the Friendship Bass Club has found a unique way to include 12 to 16 inch bass when they fish West Point Reservoir. These fish are measured and released immediately, weight is estimated based on standard values.

More tournament reports were received from Eufaula (45) and Weiss (44) than any other locations. The Mobile Delta, Martin, Logan Martin, Harris and Guntersville each had more than 20 tournament reports (Table 1). Tournament reports were distributed more evenly over the State's major reservoirs than in previous years. This good distribution of the reports provides more representative catch statistics from which meaningful summaries can be prepared.

Of the 33 reservoirs from which reports were received, 23 had five or more tournament reports (up from 19 in 1989). The following comments deal with these 23 reservoirs only (Table 2). The percent of successful fishermen (with one or more fish) ranged from 39 at West Point to 86 at Logan Martin. West Point, by virtue of the 16-inch size limit, continues to be the lowest ranked reservoir in this category.

The average weight of bass harvested ranged from 1.31 pounds at Martin to 3.19 pounds at West Point (Table 1). The statewide average remained unchanged from 1989 at 1.65 pounds. Catch rates ranged from a high of 3.38 bass per fisherman-day at Little Bear to 1.15 at Wilson. The statewide average was 2.51, down from last year's 2.79 bass per fisherman-day. Catch in pounds per fisherman-day ranged from a high of 5.37 at Mitchell to 2.51 at Wilson. The statewide average was 4.15, a decrease of 0.44

pounds per fisherman-day from 1989. Thirteen locations had catches in excess of 4.0 pounds per fisherman-day, six more than last year. Eufaula again led all reservoirs in the catch of bass larger than five pounds with 280 fish. A summary of all bass 8 pounds and larger caught this year is presented in Table 5.

Overall, Weiss was judged the top-ranked reservoir in Alabama, replacing the three time winner Eufaula. Weiss accumulating a total score of 91 of a possible 115 points (Table 2). Mitchell ranked second with 87 points and Eufaula slipped to a third place tie with Wheeler.

Several surprises occurred in the 1990 quality indicator rankings (Table 2). The biggest was that Eufaula was surpassed by Little Bear and Mitchell in the catch (number and pounds) per fisherman-day. Little Bear is a 1,560 acre TVA impoundment, little known outside of northwest Alabama. Another surprise was that West Point managed to escape from the basement in these same two categories. In fact, the pounds per fisherman-day at West Point was exceeded by only 10 of the 23 reservoirs, a remarkable achievement considering that the West Point data includes only fish 16-inches and larger.

Seven clubs provided length frequency data on tournament catches, and are to be commended for providing this additional information. Unfortunately too few clubs supported this effort during 1990 so representative length groups and catch rates could not be developed. With this low level of support, length frequency information will not be requested in 1991.




