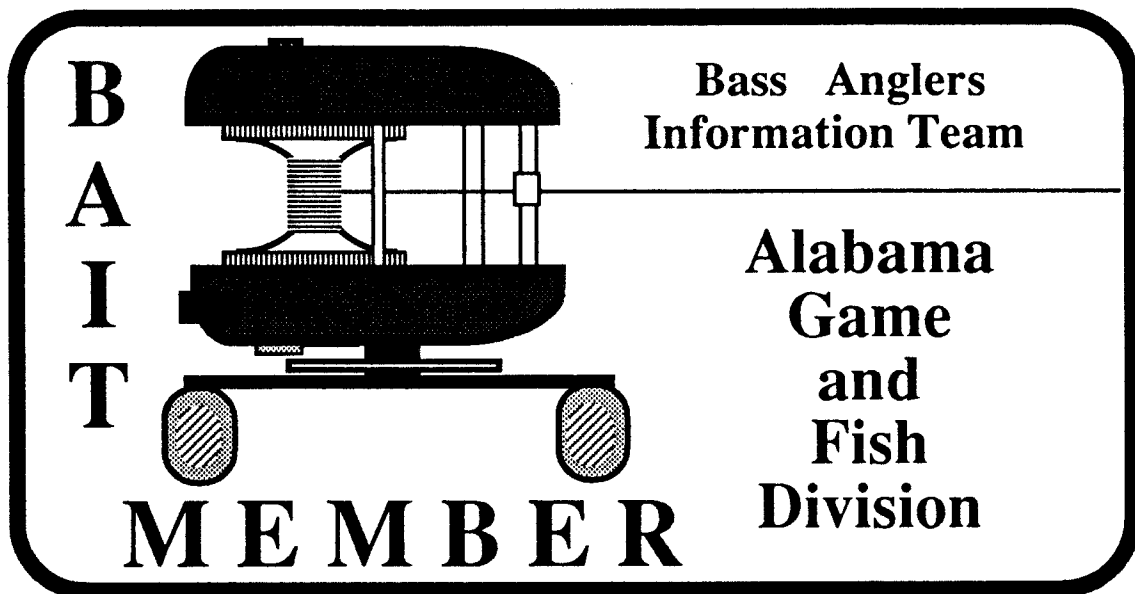

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## **INTRODUCTION**

In 1991 the B.A.I.T. program completed six years of bass tournament summarization. The objective of the program has always been to gather information on bass populations by combining the efforts of bass club members and state fisheries biologists. The B.A.I.T. program summarizes catch data already being collected by participating clubs on reservoir bass populations. State fisheries biologists use the results in combination with data from other sources to base fisheries management decisions. Bass fishermen use the report to establish future tournament sites or to locate a reservoir that provides a particular type of fishing action.

Through 1991, 1,988 tournament reports were summarized. More than 130 clubs participated through the first six years of the program. Bass fishermen have spent 54,959 angler-days and 534,834 hours collecting data for this program. They have contributed data from 134,555 bass that weighed 217,909 pounds.

## **METHODS**

Every year an effort has been made to maintain the support of the previous years' clubs and to enlist the support of new clubs through news releases and letters. Participating club officers or tournament directors are sent the previous year's annual report, with tournament report postcards to be completed following each tournament. Clubs are assigned individual numbers to insure confidentiality. As tournament cards are received, they are checked for accuracy and entered into a computer database. Club officers are contacted when data are suspected to be erroneous.

Compilation and analysis of the data are performed following receipt of December tournament data. Statewide information is sorted by reservoir, and by participating club. To rank reservoirs, five "fishing quality" indicators were used: percent of successful fishermen

(percent of fishermen with one or more bass at weigh-in), bass average weight, number of bass per fisherman-day, pounds of bass per fisherman-day, and hours required to catch a bass five pounds or larger. Since the length of a fishing day varies between tournaments, a fisherman-day is defined as 10 hours of fishing effort. A minimum of five tournaments for an individual reservoir is considered necessary for minimum confidence in each reservoir dataset. Reservoirs with five or more tournament reports are ranked for each of the quality indicators. Values are assigned to each rank and an overall rank is determined for each reservoir by summing the values of the five quality indicators. This ranking system is intended to be a quick reference for club tournament site selection. It is not a "best and worst" list and should not be interpreted that way.

## **RESULTS AND DISCUSSION**

Bass clubs submitted 400 tournament reports during 1991. Club representatives did an excellent job filling out the cards and few reports were rejected due to incomplete or erroneous information. Twenty seven more reports were received in 1991 than in 1990. Sixty clubs provided data in 1991, six more than in 1990. Eighty six tournament reports from Alabama waters were received from Dr. Carl Quertermus of West Georgia College, who summarizes tournament data from the Georgia B.A.S.S. Federation. Once again we must stress that reports from more locations increase the capability of the summaries to reflect actual conditions and not just a good or poor day's fishing by one or two clubs.

In 1991, tournament reports were received for 32 bodies of water that were fished 12,575 angler-days or 123,278 hours. B.A.I.T. anglers caught 32,025 bass (12 inches and larger) that weighed 52,855 pounds (Table 1). A total of 558 bass five pounds and larger were reported. One bass larger than 10 pounds was caught in Harris Reservoir (Table 5). The

More tournament reports were received from Eufaula (46) and Weiss (45) than any other locations. The Mobile Delta, Martin, Lay, Logan Martin, Harris and Guntersville each had more than 20 tournament reports (Table 1). Distribution of tournament report locations did not improve last year. A good distribution of reports provides more representative catch statistics from which meaningful summaries can be prepared. The B.A.I.T. program has always needed more reports from Bankhead, Cedar Creek, Coffeerville, Harding, Holt, Smith, Tuscaloosa, Warrior, and Wilson. We request that B.A.I.T. club members solicit the support of clubs that fish these waters and are not B.A.I.T. members.

Of the 32 reservoirs from which reports were received, 19 had five or more tournament reports (4 less than in 1990). The following comments deal with these 19 reservoirs (Table 2). The percent of successful fishermen (those with one or more fish) ranged from 51 at Aliceville to 88 at Millers Ferry. The average weight of bass harvested ranged from 2.82 pounds at West Point (16-inch size limit) to 1.27 pounds at Martin (Table 1). These same reservoirs were at the top and bottom of the list last year. The statewide average weight remained the same in 1989, 1990 and 1991 at 1.65 pounds. Catch rates ranged from a high of 3.78 bass per fisherman-day at Millers Ferry to 1.29 at West Point. The statewide average was 2.60, similar to last year's 2.51 bass per fisherman-day. Catch rate expressed as pounds per fisherman-day ranged from a high of 5.98 at Millers Ferry to 2.93 at Wheeler. The statewide average was 4.29, a slight increase from last year's value of 4.15.

Two reservoirs had catch rates of over 5 pounds per fisherman-day. Ten locations had catches in excess of 4.0 pounds per fisherman-day, three less than last year. Eufaula again led all reservoirs in the catch of bass larger than five pounds with 116 fish. However, 280 fish five pounds or larger were caught last year from essentially the same number of tournaments (46 in

1991 and 45 in 1990). A summary of all bass 8 pounds and larger caught this year is presented in Table 5.

Overall, Millers Ferry was judged the top-ranked reservoir in Alabama, replacing Weiss from last year. Millers Ferry accumulated a total score of 73 of a possible 95 points (Table 2). Neely Henry ranked second with 72 points and Weiss slipped from first to third place. However, only three points separated the first three reservoirs.

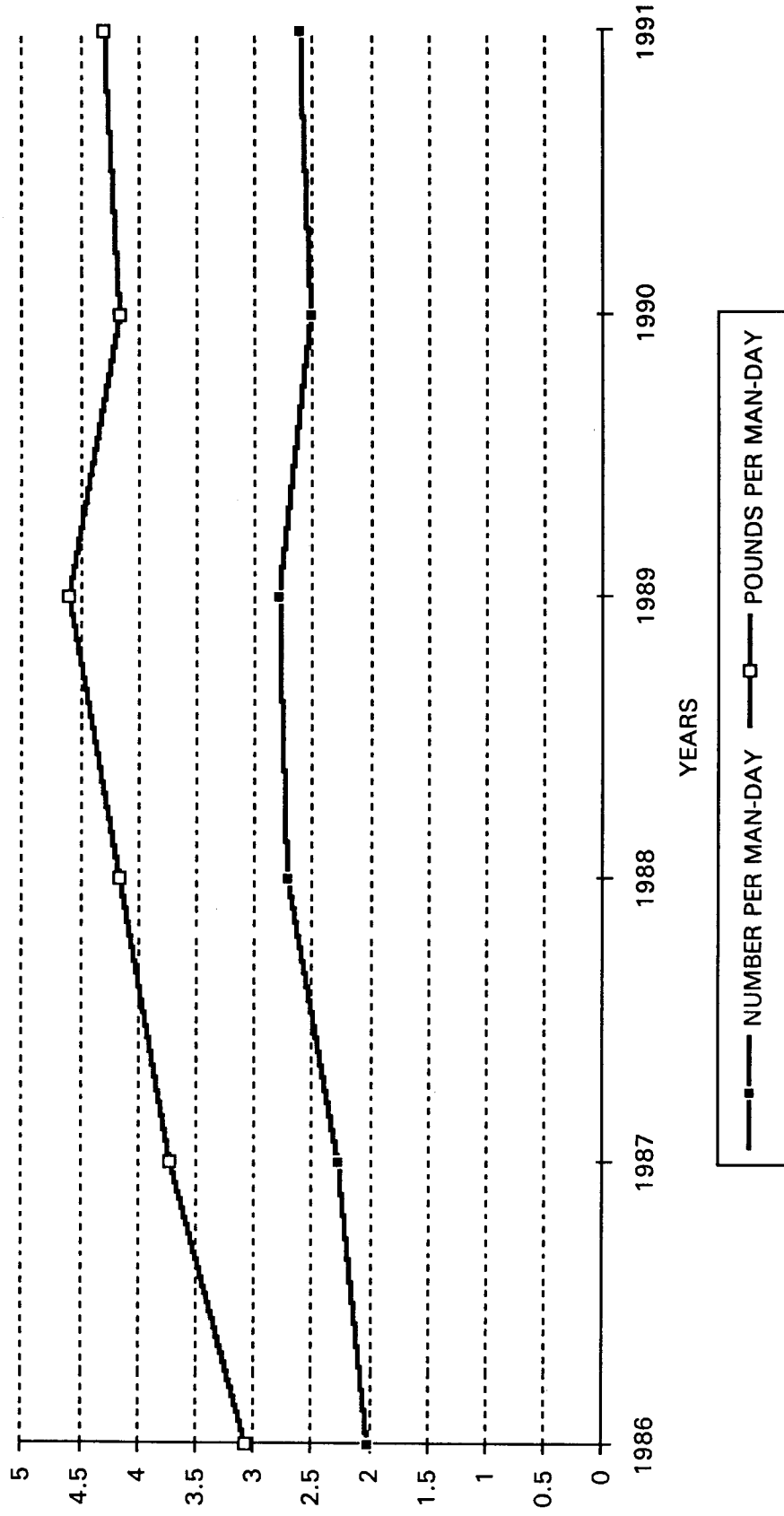


FIGURE 2. GUNTERSVILLE QUALITY INDICATORS

Several interesting changes occurred in the 1991 quality indicator rankings (Table 2). Of last year's top five lakes, only Weiss returned. Mitchell, Logan Martin, and Eufaula fell to the middle of the list, and Wheeler dropped to third from the bottom. Guntersville and Jordan achieved the greatest gains of any of this year's top five lakes. Guntersville rose from seventeenth to fourth and Jordan came from eighteenth place to fill the fifth place position. Guntersville fishermen have expressed concern in the last 12 to 18 months over the loss of aquatic vegetation and the effect this would have on bass fishing success. Data presented in Figure 2 indicate no consistent trend over the past six years with the quality indicators, bass per man-day and pounds per man-day. However, the hours required to catch a bass five pounds or larger has consistently declined over the past five years. This indicates that catch rates of these large fish have increased and may reflect one or more abundant year classes or increased vulnerability to harvest. We will continue to watch Guntersville closely from B.A.I.T. and standard electrofishing data. Eufaula, after holding the top position for three consecutive years, fell to third place last year and dropped again this year to eighth. Although quality indicator values for Eufaula changed little since last year, other lakes simply recorded higher values and pushed Eufaula down in the ratings.
